5 Facts About Immigration Proceedings in Colorado

- Universal representation promotes due process and dignity and results in better outcomes. Immigrants with a lawyer are up to ten times more likely to establish a right to remain in the US.
- In 2019, Colorado received nearly 8,500 immigration deportation court matters.
- Nearly 6 out of 10 immigrants in these cases lacked access to legal representation.
- An equitable system that reduces lengthy detentions and deportations would save Colorado up to \$18.6 million in economic costs.

WHY UNIVERSAL LEGAL REPRESENTATION MATTERS FOR ALI

A recent report by the Colorado Fiscal Institute (CFI) found that in addition to the negative emotional and mental effects of detention and deportation on individuals and families, the direct and indirect effects also harm employers, communities, and Colorado's economy.

The Economic Costs of Not Providing Universal Representation



Colorado immigrant families lose \$3.9 million in wages when a breadwinner is detained.



State and local governments lose \$350,000 in tax revenue due to lack of representation for immigrants.



Employers shoulder nearly \$12 million in turnover costs as they struggle to replace detained or deported workers.



Colorado could save \$18.6 million under a universal representation model.
